



FAIREST LORD JESUS

This hymn extolling the beauty and virtues of Christ leads us to the praise and worship of our "beautiful savior." The vivid comparisons of all the enjoyable sights of nature with Jesus, who is the very source and essence of all beauty, fill us with awe. Then we are reminded that our Savior out shines all creations of God, including the hosts of angels. How worthy He is of the deepest "glory and honor, praise, adoration now and forevermore."

Little is known of the origins of this hymn. It is thought by some to have been sung in the 12th century by the German crusaders as they made their way to the holy land. Another source claims that this was one of the hymns used by the followers of John Hus. These were Moravian believers who were driven out of Bohemia in the bloody anti-Reformation purge of 1620. They settled in Silesia, now part of Poland. "Fairest Lord Jesus" is thought to be a folk hymn that came from these devout Silesian peasants. The fourth verse emphasizes the dual nature of the Savior – "Son of God and Son of Man" – as well as the praise that will be eternally His. Whatever the actual origin of this hymn, Christians have been blessed with this worshipful and joyful text, which focuses our view on the fair Son of God who reveals to us the glory of the Father.

- 1. Fairest Lord Jesus! Ruler of all nature! O Thou of God to earth came down; thee will I cherish, thee will I honor, thou, my soul's glory, joy and crown.
- 2. Fair are the meadows, fairer still the woodlands, robed in the blooming garb of spring; Jesus is fairer, Jesus is purer, who makes the woeful heart to sing.
- 3. Fair is the sunshine, fairer still the moon light, and all the twinkling starry hosts: Jesus shines brighter, Jesus shines purer, than all the angels heaven can boast.
- 4. Beautiful Savior! Lord of the nations! Son of God and Son of Man! Glory and honor, praise, adoration now and forevermore be Thine!

Today I broke my favorite figurine of a Cockatoo. It was my grandmother's and I loved it and loved looking at it. To think, I felt sadness over a statue. Then I thought how precious this little statue was to me, not because of the statue but because of the memory of my grandmother.

I began to think of other precious things in my life. We eat broken bread we share in the depth of our Lord and His broken life. Broken flowers give perfume. Broken incense is used in adoration. A broken ship saved Paul and many other passengers on their way to Rome. Sometimes the only way the good Lord can get into some hearts is to break them.

The people who condemned Christ to death and crucified Him did not understand what really happened that day, they thought that beating him to submission, crucifying Him and ridiculing Him to the moment of His death showed that they had the ultimate power over His broken body. The truth is that Christ freely accepted His own suffering and death as His Father's will. In doing so He taught us that God's will in our own lives is not always easy, it may be even be difficult to understand. Christ's example also teaches us that sometimes true success and triumph can be disguised in what the world may think is brokenness and failure.

Look at yourself. Perhaps a disability makes it impossible for you to participate in things you used to do. Perhaps you are quick to understand or walking is not as easy as it was before. Playing golf or tennis is out of the question. You may want to blame God or someone else for this cross you must bear.

Instead, as Christ did, decide to accept these challenges as God's will in your life. Use them as an inspiration to make a difference to others. Always remain ready to allow God to use your challenges as tools to fix your brokenness and to make you a better person and the world a better place.
