
Outreach for June Greater Pittsburgh Community Foodbank

# JUST AS I AM

Often we feel that if only we were in different circumstances or had some special talent, we could be a better witness for God and serve Him more effectively. This hymn was written by a bed-ridden invalid who felt useless to do anything except express her feelings of devotion to God. Yet Charlotte Elliott's simply worded text has influenced more people for Christ than any hymn ever written or perhaps any sermon ever preached. As a young person she was known as "carefree Charlotte." She was a popular portrait artist and writer of humorous verse. At the age of 30, however, a serious ailment made her an invalid for life. She became listless and depressed until a Swiss evangelist, Dr. Caesar Malan, visited her. Sensing her spiritual distress, he exclaimed, "Charlotte, you must come just as you are – a sinner – to the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" Immediately placing her complete trust in Christ's redemptive sacrifice for her, she experienced immediate inner peace and joy in spite of her physical affliction until her death at the age of 82. She has written over 150 hymns and is considered to be one of the finest of all English hymnwriters. "God sees, God guards, God guides me," she said. "His grace surrounds me and His voice continually bids me to be happy and holy in His service - just where I am!"

# Elder's Corner

A critic is a person who corrects people, not mistakes. Jesus corrected mistakes, not people.

Can you remember how the Sadducees tried to trap Jesus? They asked him a trick question and Jesus replied, "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God. Jesus corrected their lack of knowledge, not them. When we criticize out emphasis is almost always on the weakness of the person. Jesus talked about the weakness of position.

When I write on a piece of paper I make many mistakes. I erase my mistakes and redo the words and proceed. Critics do not try to erase mistakes; they strive to blot out the person. When you blot out the person, there is no more writing. When you erase the mistake the person has another chance.

One day Peter came to Jesus and asked him, "How many time should I forgive my brother when he sins against me, up to 7 times?" Jesus replied, "I tell you not 7 times, but seventy." That was Jesus' way of saying errors are to be corrected. But Peter was thinking in terms of correcting people.

One day my husband lent our VCR to a neighbor. When the neighbor brought it back I attempted to reconnect it. When I tried it, it wouldn't work. I asked my husband to look at it. When he did I had put the cord in the wrong spot. He said "All is ok, come see which connection is for the VCR." My husband did not say "Stupid, anyone can see that the cord goes here". My husband corrected the mistake, not me.

Keep in mind that corrections change people while criticism only makes them angry.
