



From World Vision: Help us bring water points to the people who need it the most.

The global water crisis is one of the biggest public health crises of our day. More than 800 children under 5 die every day from drinking contaminated water. The reason for these deaths is that water is still collected by hundreds of millions of people from rivers and lakes and open wells. In fact, 771 million people do not have access to a basic clean water source for their homes. That's 1 out of every 10 people on the planet.

World Vision has become the largest nongovernmental provider of clean drinking water – reaching one new person with clean water every 10 seconds. We're committed to reach everyone, everywhere we work with clean water by 2030 - some 50 million people.

WHAT IS A WATER POINT?

World Vision determines the type of water point to provide in a community based on an assessment of what will be most sustainable, cost-effective and based on the available water sources. Types of water points may include a water kiosk in a community, a hand-pump well, or a solar-powered system. The water may be provided through a borehole drilled by a drilling rig. Or, it may be provided by a water source such as a protected spring and then a piped water system running into a community. Each water system is either protected or treated to ensure it is safe for users to drink.

Our standard is to ensure that every community member has access to water within 30 minutes roundtrip of their home, including the waiting time at the water point. This means that the number of water points we have in a specific area will vary by population and geography. On average, we estimate about 200-300 people are served by each water point. Therefore, depending on the yield of the system, many thousands of people could be served by one complete system.

An independent study funded by the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation and conducted by the University of North Carolina Water Institute in the Greater Afram Plains region of Ghana showed that nearly 80% of wells installed by World Vision were still functioning at high levels after nearly two decades. In contrast, previous studies have shown that 30% to 50% of non -World Vision-installed wells are not repaired when they inevitably break down. The reason for this high level of success is that we work with communities to ensure they own the water points and are able to fix them when they break down.





Open My Eyes, That O May See

In order to receive God's truth properly, then, we must have our entire being alive and alert to His every prompting. In general, most Christians do no deliberately and dramatically disobey God. Instead we simply do not heed Him by being sensitive to His leading in the small details of our lives. How important that we learn the lesson taught by this hymn text that we should have seeing eyes, hearing ears, a verbal communication of the truth, and a loving heart for sharing God's love. All of this is possible as we are illuminated by the Holy Spirit during times of quiet waiting. Clara Scott, author and composer of this hymn was a prolific composer of vocal and instrumental music. The text of this hymn has been widely used to help believers have a greater awareness of God's will for their lives and a readiness to obey.

Open my eyes, that I may see glimpses of truth Thou hast for me; place in my hands the wonderful key that shall unclasp and set me free. Silently now I wait for Thee, ready, my God, Thy will to see; open my eyes – illumine me, Spirit divine!

Open my ears, that I may hear voices of truth Thou sendest clear, and while the wave-notes fall on my ear, every thing false will disappear. Silently now I wait for Thee, ready my God, Thy will to see; open my ears – illumine me, Spirit divine!

Open my mouth, and let me bear gladly the warm truth every where. Open me heart and let me prepare love with Thy children thus to share. Silently now I wait for Thee, ready, my God, Thy will to see, open my heart – illumine me, Spirit divine.

Elder's Corner

I might as well tell you now; God has turned my life upside down. As it turns out will be right side up. This is what Jesus does. He radically transforms the lives of the people he encounters by rearranging their priorities. Perhaps that is why I avoid a deeply personal encounter with Jesus; because I am afraid of that radical transformation. I will look back a few years from now on things I thought were so very important today and realize that they were not, and that my new priorities have more truth, beauty and wisdom.

Throughout the Gospels we see Jesus challenging people's priorities and, in the process, radically transforming their lives.

I remember one story of change that I told my religion class. The story of Zacchaeus is a wonderful and radical tale of transformation. I began by telling who Zacchaeus was, and when it says, "He was trying to see who Jesus was." This tells us he was proactively seeking Jesus. I see change here.

How about Nicodemus coming to Jesus in the night presumably so that nobody would see him consulting with Jesus. They conversed and then Nicodemus said, "How can these things be?" Later in the Gospels Nicodemus tried to defend Jesus to the other Phariseess. "Does our law judge a man without hearing and learning what he does?" Sounds like a transformation to me! There are so many other stories, such as Saul the centurion and Lazarus are just a few more I can think of. The Gospel has had a radical impact of countless lives since Jesus walked the earth. It is guaranteed to have a radical impact on your life and mine.

Upside down points to ponder, Be open.

Verse to think about: Create in me clean heart O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." PSALM 51:10.

Consider this: What's preventing you from making yourself available to God?

I pray: Jesus makes me 100 percent available to you today.
